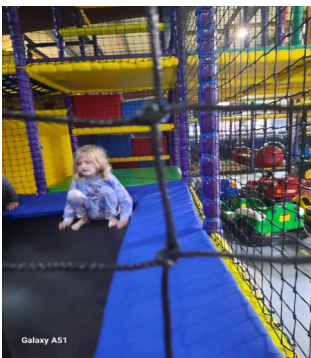


November 2023

Class Holly went to Secret Valley and got to look at and hold the animals.



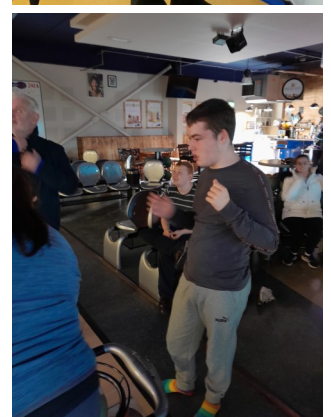
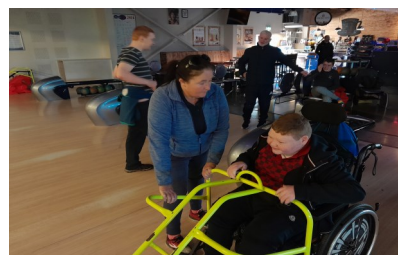
Class Saplings were working on Road Safety. Here they are dressed in the high-viz vests out for a walk.

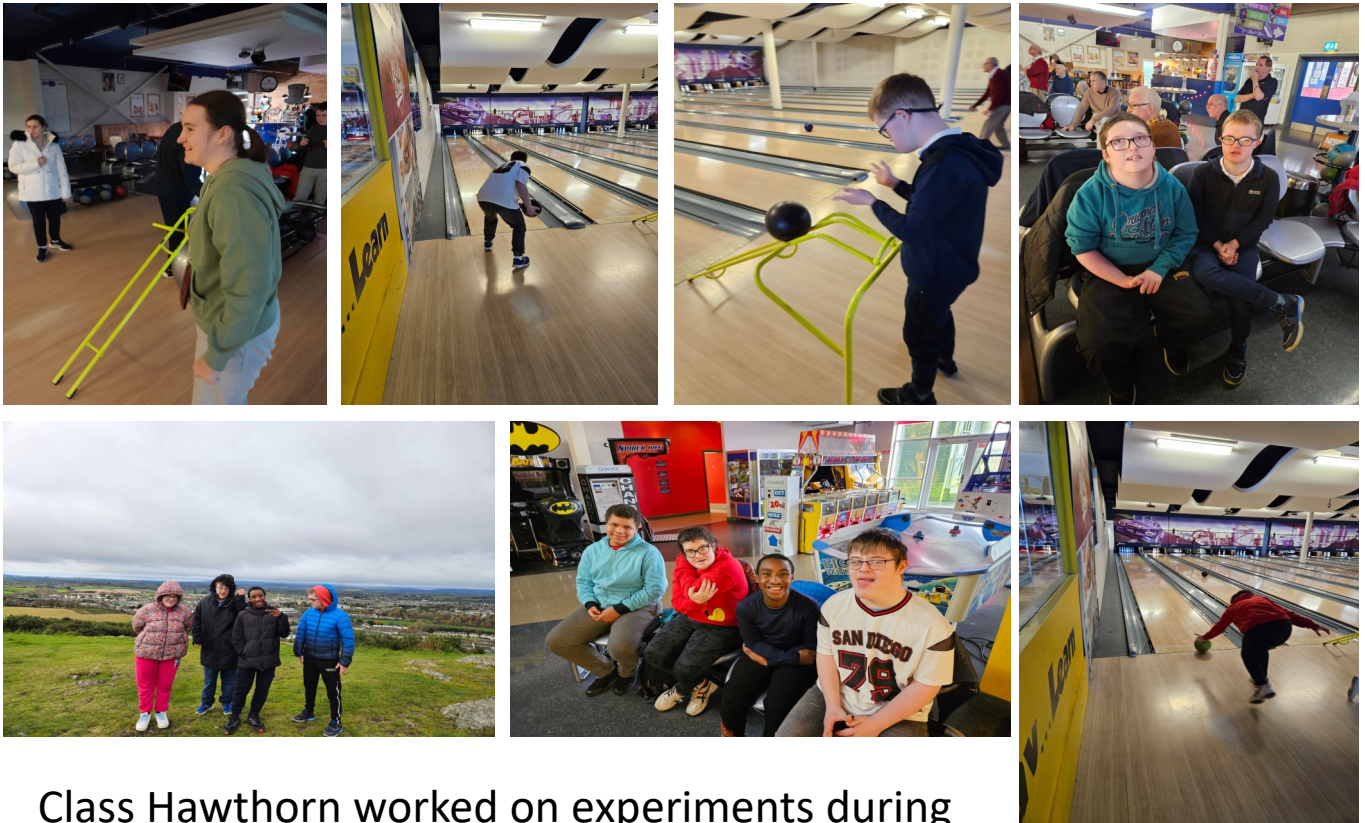


Class Poppy were having fun with food colourings as part of Science week, and they also got out to the park.



Classes Sycamore and Elm have been busy this month. Both went bowling to Leisure Max and Class Elm went out for a walk up Vinegar Hill.

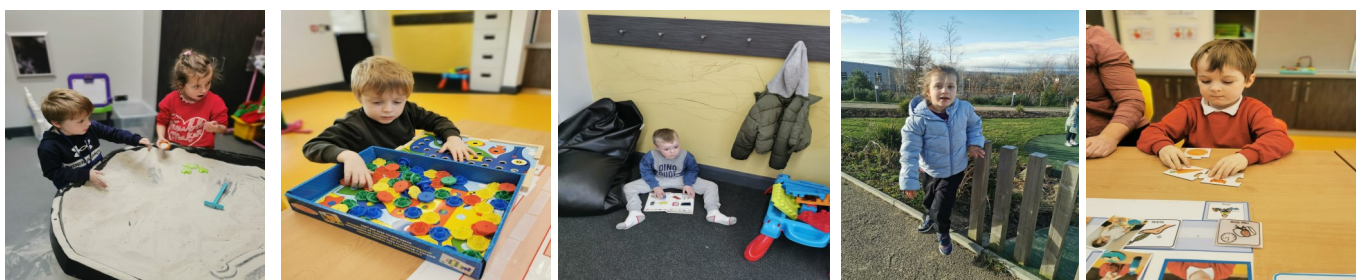




Class Hawthorn worked on experiments during Science Week and they also went on a trip to Johnstown Castle.
