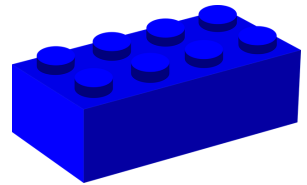
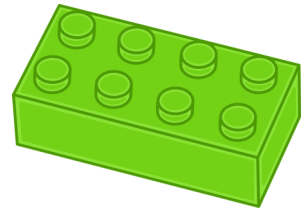
# Maths Week
